IN CHARGE

We caught up with the gaffer following Tuesday's game to share his thoughts on pre-season so far...

Gavin, thank you for talking to us. A goalless draw against Spurs' Under 21s - it's the first time that's happened - but certainly an engrossing affair...

Yeah: we haven't scored a goal in two games, I'm fully aware of that! But look, you know, it's not surprising and I've said this all along from the very start and early on what these two games were set up to do - we'd worked heavily on how we set up our position, especially in the lower mid-block - I'm not saying that that's what we're going to do; there will be aspects of our play when we are going to need to do that ... I thought particularly tonight was fantastic. We've changed the whole 11 at half time with some lads who are trying to impress and some people badged as trialists and you're playing against a very good Spurs side who move the ball really well, are sharp, cut off your passing options very quickly when you're in possession of the ball, and do everything that you'd expect from a from a top Premier League side. We stuck in there and the boys had been given a series of tasks to get through over these two games and they've done it admirably ... The idea for how we've set up in these two games - and these were deliberate games - was to not get played through and I think we've achieved largely that, but obviously there's still a bit of work to do because you'd expect a side like Spurs to open you up on occasions and it's all about limiting those occasions.

[On progress tonight and ahead of the Bracknell game]

I'm really, really pleased - it's given me a foundation to go forward now - we're picking up a new side, we're bringing some new players in, and we're trying to fit them into what I want - and that's really not an easy

task when you sometimes have them for one day a week or two hours on a Thursday night. Some aspects of our play tonight where, particularly in possession, we've got to massively improve and there's no question about that - I said it after Saturday's game that we tend to have a muscle movement of just going long and I think we're better players than that. And that's now our job to try and get that scoped into training and scoped into our playing. Saturday's a really good test for us and the reason it's been put in place - against a good step three side, because we know that in Bracknell from last year - is let's see where we are. End of week three; let's see where we are. We're playing a good team at our level; how are we functioning? And then it's a case of whether it's a total going back to the drawing board or whether it's just we need to enhance these bits and give us an extra five, ten percent - we'll see.

The attendance was well over a thousand tonight - I think 1,125 - which for you, coming into a club like this, must be extremely pleasing...

It's incredible really. You know I probably owe an apology because my ears are not as young as they used to be and as I understand they wanted a wave from me and I had to be reminded by some people behind me with younger ears that's what they were asking for! It speaks volumes doesn't it. It's a pre-season friendly - alright it's Spurs, and geographically it's close and probably there's mixed emotions from some of our supporters because it's probably their Premier League club, but from our point of view you know to have that amount of people out for a pre-season friendly on a Tuesday night when we're not playing our free-flowing football - we're looking at certain things - and to keep supporting us to the end and clap the boys off as they did tonight and Saturday is fairly new to me of course and very humbling.

INTRODUCING...

BRACKNELL TOWN

Originally founded in 1896 as Old Bracknell Wanderers, the club joined the Ascot & District League in 1904, becoming league champions in the 1911-12 season, and winning further titles in 1914 and 1933.

In 1949 they switched to the Reading & District League and were renamed Bracknell Football Club, remaining in the league until joining the Great Western Combination in 1958. In 1962 the club adopted its current name, and a year later joined the Surrey Senior League. They finished bottom of the league in 1965-66, but went on to win the League Cup in 1968-69 and the double of the title and League Cup in 1969-70. Spells in the Spartan and Isthmian Leagues would follow. In 2000-01 the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first

time, eventually losing 4-0 at Lincoln City. Further league reorganisation in 2002 saw Bracknell placed in the Isthmian Division One South, and two seasons later they were transferred to Division One West of the Southern League. After relegation to the Hellenic League in 2010, the 2016-17 season saw the club win three cups; the Hellenic League Challenge Cup, the Berks & Bucks County Senior Trophy, and the club the Reading Senior Cup final with victory over Binfield. In 2017-18 Bracknell were runners-up in the Hellenic League Premier Division, earning promotion to the South Central Division of the Isthmian League, as well as retaining the Challenge Cup with a 3-1 win over Thatcham Town in the final. The following season saw them finish as runners-up in the Isthmian League's South Central Division, qualifying

for the promotion play-offs. After beating Westfield 2-1 in the semi-finals, they lost 3-0 to Cheshunt in the final. However, 2021-22 would see the club storm away to win the division, securing the championship by mid-March and earning promotion to the Premier Division South of the Southern League. The remarkable rise very nearly continued unabated. Last season saw Bracknell qualify for the first round of the FA Cup for the second time, with the club losing 3-0 at home to Ipswich Town. They went on to finish as runners-up in the Premier Division South, defeating Chesham United 1-0 in the play-off semi-finals, though they lost out 3-2 to Truro City in the final. During the season they also won the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup for the first time, winning the final against Marlow 1-0.

MICHAEL EACOTT (Goalkeeper)

Previously of South Park and Epsom & Ewell, Michael has been between the sticks for Bracknell for the previous two seasons, joining ahead of the Robins' title-winning 21-22 season in the Isthmian South Central. He had previously skipped rivals Sutton Common Rovers, making 98 appearances, and helping them to promotion up to step 4.

RYAN BIRD (Defender)

A centre-back or centre-forward, veteran Ryan Bird began his footballing career in the academy at Burnham, promoted to first team in December 2004 initially as a central defender, before re-establishing himself as a striker. After nine years in Buckinghamshire, he accrued a wealth of experience with the likes of Portsmouth, Cambridge United, Yeovil Town, Dover Athletic, and Slough Town, among others.

SEAN FRASER (Defender)

Defender Sean Fraser arrived at Bracknell in October 2022 from league rivals Beaconsfield Town, who he had joined in the summer. A Slough Town legend, he made 366 appearances across a decade before departing in 2022. His other previous clubs include Falkirk, Coventry City, Marlow, and Banbury United.

DARRYL HARRISON (Defender)

Centre back Darryl arrives at Bracknell from Chertsey Town, where he enjoyed a couple of stints and was an ever-present in the 21-22 season, making 47 appearances and chipping in with three goals as the Curfews reached the Isthmian South Central play-off final. He was also previously with Ashford Town and had a brief period at Carshalton Athletic at the beginning of last season.

ETHAN BURDEN (Defender)

Named in the Isthmian South Central team of the season for Bracknell's promotion-winning 2021-22 campaign, left-back Ethan is now into his third season with the Robins. He had previously worn the shirts of Burnham, Binfield, and Ascot United.

ELLIOTT LEGG (Defender)

Right-back Elliott re-joined Bracknell in October 2022 having departed three years prior for Binfield, with whom he reached the FA Vase final at Wembley in 2021. He has also played for Marlow.

MASSIMO GIAMATTEI (Midfielder)

A former Robin and nominee in the Isthmian South Central team of the year, Massimo is a versatile option in central midfield or on the right flank. He returns to Bracknell having had an initial spell with the club in 2021 following his release from Swindon Town. He has also represented Hanwell Town and Binfield.

KJ OSU (Midfielder)

Another versatile midfielder, Olukayode 'KJ' Osu is eligible to play for England, Italy or Nigeria. After stints as a youngster with Fulham, Aldershot Town and AFC Wimbledon's academies, and in non-league with Staines Town, he moved to Belgium to sign his first professional contract with KSV Roeselare, thence to Chions (Italy) and back to England with Hartley Wintney.

ASHLEY LODGE (Midfielder)

Experienced midfielder Ashley signed for Bracknell in the 2022 off-season from Chertsey Town. He was a former fan favourite at Staines Town, where he enjoyed a couple of spells and made over 150 appearances as well as picking up several player awards prior to his departure in December 2015. He also counts Molesey, Ashford Town (Middx), Egham Town and Hayes & Yeading among his previous sides.

JACK PENTON (Midfielder)

A 19-year-old midfielder, Jack was dual-registered with Burnham FC from November last season and joins Bracknell again at the start of this campaign. Well-regarded by both clubs, he began to develop a regular eye for goal from the centre of the park last year.

LIAM TACK (Midfielder)

Tacky' teamed up again with his former managers in Carl Withers and Jamie McClurg, joining Bracknell from Binfield in November 2022 and helping the Robins to second place in last year's Southern League Premier with 90 points. He had 62 times for the Moles, scoring 10 goals, and was previously with Thame United and Hanwell Town.

GEORGE KNIGHT (Midfielder)

Returning for this season is George Knight; an ever-present in the heart of the Robins' midfield last campaign with 10 goals in 50 appearances. Prior to his time at Bracknell, he had spent three years in the USA, playing for Lander University's Bearcats.

CONNOR HOLLAND (Midfielder)

A former Robins Under-18 player, attacking midfielder Connor returns ahead of this season from neighbours Binfield, where he had scored 7 goals from midfield in 37 appearances last term. He had been with the Moles since July 2022 after arriving from Ashford Town (Middx), and had also previously featured for Knaphill and Wokingham & Emmbrook.

ZIDAN AKERS (Forward)

A tall, tricky, right-sided winger, Zidan started his career with Wallingford before moving into the academies at Reading and Hearts. Spells with Thatcham Town, Basingstoke Town, Walton Casuals and Hungerford Town followed before joining Bracknell in November 2021, helping them to the Isthmian South Central title.

KAMERON ENGLISH (Forward)
A pacey winger, Kameron joined Bracknell in the 2022 off-season from Marlow, where he had been top scorer the previous season. He has also had stints with Ashford Town (Middx), Harrow Borough and a brief loan spell at Hanworth Villa.

BEN HARRIS (Forward)
A prolific centre-forward Ben is a former Windsor, Hampton & Richmond and Ascot United striker who has won the New Zealand national championship with Team Wellington. The forward joined Bracknell, initially on loan, in December 2022, before rejoining ahead of the coming season.

JOE GRANT (Forward)
Wide forward Joe returned from an ACL injury last season, yet

proved to be a vital part of last season's play-off push, finishing with 24 goals as leading goal scorer for Bracknell. The Robins' Supporters Player of the Year for 2018-19, his other previous sides include Slough Town, Hayes & Yeading, Hartley Wintney, Ascot United and Molesey.

LIAM FERDINAND (Forward)
A prolific striker no stranger to Town boss Gavin Macpherson, Liam is back for another spell with the Robins for 23-24. Netting 25 goals in 29 appearances in the 21-22 season with Met Police, he joined play-off victors Farnborough before a stint with Chesham and a brief return to Bracknell. A winner at Wembley after winning the FA Vase with Thatcham Town, he was part of an FA Representative side which visited the Falkland Islands in November 2018.

IN CHARGE: JAMIE MCCLURG & CARL WITHERS

Both former Robins as players, McClurg and Withers joined the club in September 2022 from Binfield, where they had enjoyed a superb start to the season, lying second in the Isthmian South Central Division One and through to the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Cup having seen off Tonbridge two steps up by a 4-0 scoreline. They then repeated the trick to guide Bracknell to the First Round Proper against Ipswich Town – their first match at that stage for two decades – and to the Southern League play-off final after 90 points earned them second spot. They, and their side, will doubtless be eager to go one better this campaign.

TOWN HOLD SPURS YOUNG PROS

ENFIELD TOWN 0 TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR U21S 0

Just what the doctor ordered is perhaps the best way to sum up Tuesday night's prestige friendly against a Tottenham Under-21 side. Gavin and his management team got just what they asked for in terms of concentrating on how we performed off the ball, with players covering for each other and not leaving too many gaps for the visitors to exploit, writes Andrew Warshaw.

The crowd of 1,125 was a revelation, some 300 more than for the same fixture last season, and whilst there were no goals, there was plenty of encouragement for the rest of the pre-season campaign when the focus will switch to seeing how we take the game to opposition from the same level as us, or lower. It was inevitable that our visitors, many of whom had trained with the Spurs senior team and won both the under-17 and under-18 Premier League Cup, would control the game and have almost all the possession.

But in truth, they didn't carve out too many clearcut chances, the two best both saved — by Rhys Forster's spectacular tip-over from Dante Cassanova in the first half (pictured) and Adi Connolly pushing Lyons-Foster's deflected effort onto the upright in the second period. Rio Kyerematen and Nile John missed further chances but although Tottenham's pace and



dribbling skills were there for all to see, we kept our shape throughout and closed off the spaces as best we could.

Just as against QPR on Saturday, Gavin fielded two separate elevens in each half, with five of our summer recruits playing the first 45 minutes and Reece Beckles-Richards making a promising Town debut when introduced after halftime. Louis Birch's lung-busting industry and Ollie Knight's crossing ability will surely be huge assets and although he was still nursing an injury, it was encouraging to see Jake Cass do some light running on the touchline as he attempts to regain fitness.

"Very pleased with our night's work," said Gavin afterwards. "How often have we been broken down by two professional clubs, on Saturday and tonight? Not that often. Your out of possession work is worth a lot points." "What we saw in the last two games

is what we've been working on in training. We can now tick that box to an extent and move on to what we want to build with the ball." "That'll take some time. I'm still seeing things I don't particularly like such as going long too quickly. We've got different ideas and the players are having to adapt. Having said that, they are not going to meet teams at Step 3 as sharp as Spurs in terms of closing down your passing options."

Next up Bracknell. "They're a very good Step 3 side," said Gavin. "It's a good opportunity almost at the halfway stage of pre-season to see where we're at against a side at our level."

GLASS CEILING ON FOOTBALL'S BIGGEST STAGE

By the time you read this, the women's World Cup will be firmly under way and England will have just completed their first game against underdogs Haiti.

But behind the scenes an old chestnut continues to rumble on: whether women footballers should have equal prize money to men. Days out from the start of the tournament, teams were turning up the pressure on the sport's governing body, FIFA.

Three days before the big kick-off last Thursday, members of co-hosts Australia released a video taking a swing at FIFA's failure to grant women the same prize money as their male counterparts. The total prize pool for the women's tournament was raised to \$150 million this year – a 300 percent increase on 2019 yet still only about a third of the \$440 million handed to the winners of last year's men's World Cup in Qatar. Everyone will have their view on whether this is justified but the women players argue it most definitely is not. The assumption that women's sports are inferior to men's, and therefore less deserving financially, has long been a burning issue. But while Wimbledon prize money, for instance, is now the same for both genders and men's and women's cricket teams will in future receive equal prize money at all ICC tournaments, football is still lagging behind. The Australian World Cup squad say such gender disparity is totally unfair, as is the fact some nations do not have collective bargaining rights.

"736 footballers have the honour of representing their countries on the biggest stage this tournament," said Australia and Everton midfielder Clare Wheeler in the aforementioned video. Western Sydney Wanderers' Clare Hunt added: "Yet many are still denied the basic right to organise and collectively bargain." Speaking at the FIFA Congress in March, FIFA president Gianni Infantino pledged: "Our ambition is to have equality in payments for the 2026 men's and 2027 women's World Cup. This is the objective that we set to ourselves. FIFA is stepping up with actions, not just with words."

Really? Will FIFA actually put their money where their mouth is? Believe it when you see it. Australia are not the only team to speak out on equal pay. From Nigeria to the UK, South Africa to Canada, there have been stand-offs between national teams and their football associations. Some teams even threatened to boycott matches. England didn't quite go that far but right up until the eve of the World Cup, the Lionesses were



locked in a performance-related bonus dispute of their own. In the end the European champions decided to put aside controversial negotiations but made clear their disappointment with the FA over an issue that could have developed into a huge distraction on the eve of the tournament. Instead, they wrote a letter to say they were unhappy with the way they are being paid throughout the competition but that they will return to the matter afterwards. For the first time, FIFA prize money will be paid directly to the Lionesses squad rather than the FA, and England's players have been pushing the FA to top up the central payments awarded to every side since 2022. Even manager Sarina Wiegman became involved, telling Sky she hoped for a "quick solution" after the team arrived in Australia.

"Last year we presented the FA with concerns relating to our bonus and commercial structures," the England squad's letter said. "The hope was that discussions would lead to a solution before the commencement of the World Cup. We are disappointed that a resolution has still not been achieved. "With our opening game on the horizon, we Lionesses have decided to pause discussions, with full intentions of revisiting them following the tournament. We collectively feel a strong sense of responsibility to grow the game and while our focus now switches fully to the tournament ahead, we believe every tackle, pass and goal will contribute to the work we are committed to doing off the pitch. "We look forward to playing for our country in this World Cup with pride, passion and perseverance."

All very laudable but at the back of their minds is another word beginning with P that is going to have to be resolved as soon as they return from Down Under: Pounds.
